Entered into force	Official draft bill (amending the existing Cybersecurity Act) submitted on 12th December 2024 accepted at the first hearing of the National Assembly on 20 February 2025. Second hearing is expected soon.

Scope (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	Follows NIS-2
Registration	The obliged persons are defined as per Article 2 of Directive (EU) 2022/2552. The register is to be created and maintained by the Electronic Government Minister.
Information Security Standards referenced	Reference to the definition as per Article 2 of Regulation (EU) 1025/2012.
Incident reporting	Essential and important entities must report significant security incidents to Sectoral Computer Security Incident Response Teams and if the sectoral teams identify cross-border or intersectoral significant incident, they notify the National Computer Security Incident Response Team.
Authority / CSIRT	Minister of eGovernment / National and Sectoral Computer Security Incident Response Teams
Fines (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	 Follow NIS-2. For non-compliance with cybersecurity risk-management measures requirements and non-performance of reporting obligations: Fines for essential entities: From BGN 50.000 (app. EUR 25.000) to 2% of the global annual turnover but not less than BGN 20.000.000 (app. EUR 10.000.000). Fines for important entities from BGN 25.000 (app. EUR 12.500) to 1,4 % of the global annual turnover but not less than BGN 14.000.000 (app. EUR 7.000.000).
Worth mentioning	Not identified to this moment as per the draft law.
