Scope (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	(Additional) categories of entities in scope: Follows NIS-2, includes additional sectors such as postal and courier services, waste management, etc.
Registration	Essential and important entities must register via the cybersecurity information system, administered by the National Cybersecurity Center. It is recommended to do the self-registration with the Institut Luxembourgeois de Régulation (ILR) as soon as possible to determine if the entity is under the scope of the directive.

Incident reporting	Essential and important entities must report to the The Institut Luxembourgeois de Régulation (ILR).
Authority / CSIRT	The Institut Luxembourgeois de Régulation (ILR) and the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (CSSF)
Fines (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	Distinctive administrative fines for essentials and important entities: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Essentials entities: Administrative fine of at least EUR 10.000.000 or at least 2% of the total worldwide annual turnover of the preceding financial year.• Important entities: Administrative fine at least EUR 7.000.000 or at least 1,4% of the total worldwide annual turnover of the preceding financial year.
Worth mentioning	Draft law acknowledges the potential overlap with sector-specific regulations, such as those in the aviation sector.
