Entered into force	Not yet foreseeable, draft bill must be passed by the parliament

Scope (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	(Additional) categories of entities in scope: Follows NIS2 but extended some sectors e.g. nuclear energy sector, healthcare.
Registration	Essential entities and important entities must register with the Ministry of Digital Affairs within three months of recognition as an essential or important entity.
Information Security Standards referenced	The Act does not specify any standard, the Act states however that the Ministry of Digital Affairs is responsible for recommending and providing support for the use of European or international standards and technical specifications that are significant for information systems security and for Promoting the adoption of ICT products, ICT services, and ICT processes that are certified under European or national cybersecurity certification programs.
Incident reporting	Essential and important entities must report to the competent authority (relevant sectoral CSIRT).
Authority / CSIRT	Ministry of Digital affairs, CSIRT MON, CSIRT NASK or CSIRT GOV
Fines (deviating from NIS-2-Directive)	 Up to PLN 100.000.000 in qualified cases. Penalties for managers of essential or important entities, amounting to up to 300% of the remuneration received by them, calculated according to the rules applicable for determining the cash equivalent for leave.
Worth mentioning	Other deviations include employee screening, regular audits in essential entities and the possibility for relevant authorities to introduce additional requirements; additional penalty for managers proposed.
